Amendments

Pursuant to House Rule 7.19, the Legislative Fiscal Office (LFO) is required to submit a report to the House of Representatives, which indicates whether the appropriation bill indicates onetime money for ordinary recurring expenses within the Reengrossed version of House Bill 1 (HB 1) with Senate Amendments.

HR 7.19 One-Time Money List

Pursuant to HR 7.19(C)(2), appropriations from one-time money for ordinary recurring expenses may not exceed the projected growth of the state general fund from the fiscal year for which the appropriation is proposed and the subsequent fiscal year according to the most recent official forecast. The threshold calculation is the difference between the official SGF revenue forecast adopted by the Revenue Estimating Conference (REC) on May 18, 2021, for FY 22 of \$9,887.5 M and for FY 23 of \$10,164.4 M, which equates to an increase of \$276.9 M in SGF revenue. The amount of one-time funds, as defined by HR 7.19, allowed to be appropriated in HB 1 for FY 22 expenditure is \$276.9 M. After adopted Senate amendments to HB 1, there is no (\$0) one-time money as defined in House Rule 7.19 in HB 1 Reengrossed with Senate Amendments.

FY 23 Replacement Financing Decision List

Although HR 7.19 contains a definition of "one-time money", the rule itself is not indicative of the financing decisions that will have to be made in FY 23 relative to the current structure of the FY 22 proposed operating budget. Due to this issue, the LFO not only provides the HR 7.19 list to comply with the House Rule, but also provides details of significant potential FY 23 financing replacements that will have to be made as a result of the proposed FY 22 budget.

Approximately \$720 M in funds that may not be available in the future are proposed to support recurring expenditures in HB 1 for FY 22 and beyond. These funds include:

- \$366.1 M FY 21 unused Medical Assistance Trust Fund means of finance swap;
- \$241.9 M FY 22 projected emergency Federal Medical Assistance Percentage (FMAP) for Medicaid;
- \$113.1 M Lottery Proceeds means of finance swap.

The current REC forecast for FY 23 is projected to grow by approximately \$276.9 M from FY 22. Therefore, this leaves \$443.1 M (\$720 M - \$276.9 M) in recurring expenditures that do not currently have a recurring revenue source.

"20-950 JUDGMENTS

Notwithstanding the provisions of R.S. 49:112, the sum of \$13,284,950.34 or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of the State General Fund (Direct) for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 to be allocated to pay consent judgments and other final judgments against the state, Board of Tax Appeals recommendations for payment of a claim against the state, and reimbursements of attorney fees, all as provided in this Section. A judgment may only

be paid from this appropriation if it is final. All judgments provided for in this Section shall be paid as to principal, interest, court costs, and expert witness fees as awarded in each judgment, it being the intent herein that when the provisions of a judgment conflict with the provisions of this Act, the provisions of the judgment shall be controlling. Any other provision of this Act not in conflict with the provisions of a judgment shall control. Payment shall be made as to each judgment, Board of Tax Appeals recommendation, or reimbursement for attorney fees only after presentation to the state treasurer of documentation required by the state treasurer. Further, all judgments provided for in this Section shall be deemed to have been paid on the effective date of the Act, and interest shall cease to run as of that date.

There is hereby established a special custodial trust statutorily dedicated fund account in the state treasury to be known as the Motor Fuel Underground Storage Tank Trust Dedicated Fund Account, hereafter referred to in this Chapter as the "Tank Trust Fund Account", into which the state treasurer shall, each fiscal year, deposit the revenues received from the collection of the fees as established in R.S. 30:2195.3(A)(1)(a) and (B). The secretary is authorized pursuant to Article VII, Section 9(A) of the Constitution of Louisiana and R.S. 30:2031 to enter into an agreement with a private legal entity to receive and administer the Tank Trust Fund Account for the purpose of providing financial responsibility for underground motor fuel storage tanks. On an annual basis, all owners of registered tanks shall remit to the department a tank registration fee of sixty dollars for each tank. The revenue from the tank registration fees shall be deposited directly into the Environmental Trust Account as provided by R.S. 30:2015 and utilized for underground storage tank activities only, and any deviation from the aforesaid shall be documented and reported to the House Committee on Natural Resources and Environment and the Senate Committee on Environmental Quality. Revenues received from annual maintenance and monitoring fees, other than those established in R.S. 30:2195.3(B), shall be deposited into the Environmental Trust Account. The department shall promulgate rules and regulations for the implementation of this Section in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act, R.S. 49:950 et seq.
- C. Monies so deposited in the Environmental Trust Account shall be used to defray the cost to the state of administering the underground storage tank program and the cost of investigation, testing, containment, control, and cleanup of releases from underground storage tanks containing regulated substances. Only monies recovered pursuant to R.S. 30:2195.2(A)(2) and deposited in the Tank Trust Fund Account may be used for the loans authorized by R.S. 30:2195.12(E). These monies shall also be used to provide money or services as the state share of matching funds for federal grants involving underground storage tanks. At the end of each fiscal year, all monies that were deposited into the Environmental Trust Account from the fees established in R.S. 30:2195.3(A)(1)(a) and (B)

which remain unspent, including all accrued interest, shall be transferred to the Tank Trust Fund Account.

- D. The funds placed in the Tank Trust Fund Account shall only be used in accordance with the terms and conditions of R.S. 30:2194 through 2195.9 and shall not be placed in the general fund but shall be subject to the appropriation process of the legislature. The monies in the Tank Trust Fund Account shall be invested by the state treasurer in the same manner as monies in the state general fund. Monies deposited into this account shall be categorized as fees and self-generated revenue for the sole purpose of reporting related to the executive budget, supporting documents, and general appropriation bills and shall be available for annual appropriation by the legislature.
- E. Annually, the department shall prepare a report for the House Committee on Natural Resources and Environment and the Senate Committee on Environmental Quality of all disbursements of monies from the Tank Trust Fund Account and the Environmental Trust Account. The report shall include all loans made from the Tank Trust Fund Account, the number of sites actively seeking reimbursement from the Tank Trust Fund Account as of June thirtieth of each year, the number of sites deemed eligible for the Tank Trust Fund Account during the previous fiscal year, and the number of sites that have been granted "No Further Action", and the department has received the last application for reimbursement during the previous fiscal year. Regarding disbursements from the Tank Trust Fund Account as provided by R.S. 30:2195.2, the report shall include a list of all reimbursements, all pending reimbursements, the date the application was made for reimbursement, and the date reimbursement was made by the department. The report shall be delivered to the respective legislative committees no later than March first of each year.
- All interest monies earned by the Motor Fuels Underground Storage Tank Trust Fund Account and all monies received from payments that are the result of cost recovery efforts shall be used for the closure of abandoned motor fuel underground storage tanks, assessment and remediation of property contaminated by abandoned motor fuel underground storage tanks, and the loans authorized by R.S. 30:2195.12(E).

(3) A tank may be declared to be an abandoned motor fuel underground storage tank by the secretary upon a finding that all of the following apply to the site:

(e) The release at the site is not eligible for the Motor Fuels Underground Storage Tank Trust Fund Tank Trust Account or the secretary has determined that action by the department is the most timely and efficient way to address conditions at the site.

The working panel shall review and rate applications submitted by community water systems, community sewer systems, and local governing authorities and submit recommendations for funding to the commission.
- D.(1) The commission shall hold its first meeting no later than June 15, 2021. At its first meeting, the commission shall issue directives to the division to utilize in the development of the guidance required in Paragraph (2) of this Subsection.
- (2) The division shall promulgate guidance for the administration of the program. The guidance shall include application requirements, deadlines for application submissions and approval, criteria for ratings, and a process for prioritizing critical infrastructure needs. The Administrative Procedure Act, R.S. 49:950 et seq., shall not apply to guidance promulgated pursuant to this Section. No later than August 1, 2021, the division shall submit the proposed guidance to the commission for review and approval. Any changes to the guidance shall require approval by the commission.
- E. In addition to the guidance provided for in Subsection D of this Section, the division shall submit a proposal outlining administrative costs for the program to the commission for review and approval prior to implementing the program no later than July 15, 2021. The commission shall review the proposed administrative costs and make a recommendation to the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget for funding for administrative costs. The Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget shall review the recommendations submitted by the commission and approve administrative costs for the program.
- F. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the division may enter into consulting services, professional services, and information and technology services contracts for the purpose of the procurement of any goods or services necessary to implement and expedite the distribution of funds as emergency procurements exempt from the provisions of the Louisiana Procurement Code and

corresponding rules and regulations. The cost of such contracts shall be considered administrative costs.

- G. Each grant recipient shall be required to provide matching funds unless the commission recommends waiving the match requirement.
- H. The division shall begin accepting applications no later than August 1, 2021. The applications shall include the following, at a minimum:
 - (1) The amount of grant funding requested.
- (2) The amount and proposed source of funding for the proposed match.
- (3) Proposals for repairs, improvements, or consolidation with neighboring systems.
- (4) Assurance the entity will comply with the rate determination of the rate study completed by a third party chosen by the division prior to release of funds for construction and permission to bid.
- (5) A certification from the local governing authority that operates the system or the water system operator that funding from the Coronavirus Fiscal Recovery Fund of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 is being used as a source of funding for the required match or explanation of legitimate cause that precluded the use of those funds for the match.
- I. Within forty-five days of the end of the application period, the division shall submit the working panel's ratings of proposed projects and recommendations for funding for the projects to the commission. The working panel's recommendations to the commission shall include recommendations for utilization of existing funding sources including the Drinking Water Revolving Loan Fund, Clean Water State Revolving Fund, and Community Water Enrichment and Other Improvements Fund.
- J. The commission shall review the ratings and recommendations submitted by the working panel. The commission shall submit its recommendations for projects to receive monies from the fund and funding amounts to the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget. The recommendations shall include proposed matching funds unless the commission recommends a waiver of matching funds or decreased match for any project based on the determination that the local governing authority or water system is unable to provide the match.
- K. The Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget shall review the recommendations submitted by the commission and have final approval of funding for projects. No monies shall be expended from the fund without approval of the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget.
- L. Beginning January 1, 2022, the division shall submit a quarterly construction progress report for projects that received funding approval to the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget.
- M. Each grant recipient that receives funding pursuant to this Section shall comply with the provisions of R.S. 24:513.
- N. The provisions of R.S. 39:72.1(A) shall not apply to monies appropriated pursuant to this Section.
- O.(1) Priority for funding shall be given to community water system projects, community sewer system projects, or projects necessitated by storm water that are contained in the Act which originated as House Bill No. 2 of the 2021 Regular Session of the Legislature.

- (2) Projects eligible pursuant to this Subsection shall not be required to submit an application pursuant to the provisions of the Section. The division may request supplemental information for the project as directed by the commission.
- P. If an appropriation for a community water system project, community sewer system project, or a project necessitated by storm water has received a line of credit or is recommended for a line of credit pursuant to the Act which originated as House Bill No. 2 of the 2021 Regular Session of the Legislature and the project is eligible for funding through the Water Sector Program, the commission may recommend to the commissioner of administration that the project not be recommended for a line of credit in lieu of funding from the Water Sector Program."
