House Bills and Joint Resolutions Returned from the Senate with Amendments

The following House Bills and Joint Resolutions returned from the Senate with amendments to be concurred in by the House were taken up and acted upon as follows:

HOUSE BILL NO. 125—

BY REPRESENTATIVES ECHOLS, GAROFALO, AND THOMPSON AN ACT

To enact R.S. 3:3613, relative to protection of agricultural lands from foreign adversaries; to restrict a foreign adversary with an ownership interest in a corporately formed business from owning or having an interest in agricultural land; to provide for exceptions; to provide for reporting requirements; to provide for definitions; to authorize the attorney general to take certain actions in response to violations involving the acquisition or sale of immovable property by foreign adversaries; to authorize certain courts to issue orders against foreign adversaries; to provide for immunity from liability for certain professionals involved in the consummation of real estate transactions; to provide for forfeiture and civil penalties; and to provide for related matters.

A person who gives a false affidavit shall be responsible for any loss or damage suffered by any person whose rights are adversely affected."

management or policies of a company, whether through ownership of securities, by contract or otherwise. A person or entity that directly or indirectly has the right to vote fifty percent or more of the voting interests of an entity or is entitled to fifty percent or more of its profits is presumed to possess a controlling interest."

- (7) The attorney general shall cause the petition or other pleading to be cancelled from the mortgage records no later than three business days after judgment is rendered or after a request for cancellation is made by any interested party seeking to transfer the property to a person other than a foreign adversary or a prohibited foreign actor. If the petition or other pleading relates to a property interest vested in a foreign adversary or a prohibited foreign actor, the attorney general may petition the court for an order requiring the proceeds of the sale attributable to the property interest of the foreign adversary or a prohibited foreign actor after the deduction of payments to mortgagees, lienholders, person providing services in connection with the transfer of the property, and credits to the purchaser relating to tax and other customary prorations, be deposited in the registry of the court in which the proceeding is pending.
- E. No attorney, title insurer, title insurance producer, title insurance agency producer, lender, mortgage servicer, notary public, real estate agent, real estate broker, seller, or lessor, or any of their directors, officers, or employees shall have a duty to make any investigation as to whether a party to a transaction involving immovable property is a foreign adversary or prohibited foreign actor, nor shall any such person be liable for failing to identify that a party to a transaction involving immovable property is a foreign adversary or prohibited foreign actor.
- F. The provisions of this Section shall apply only to property acquired by a foreign adversary or prohibited foreign actor after August 1, 2023. If a foreign adversary or prohibited foreign actor acquires immovable property despite the prohibitions contained herein, the property shall only be subject to forfeiture during the period in which the foreign adversary or prohibited foreign actor owns the property. Rights in immovable property shall not be void or voidable because the property or right therein previously was held by a foreign adversary or prohibited foreign actor."

(g) One member shall be appointed by the state representative for District No. 17.

(3) Members may be removed for cause by a two-thirds vote of the membership of the city council.

- (b) On a first conviction of an aggregate weight of twenty-eight grams or more but less than two hundred fifty grams, imprisonment at hard labor for not less than seven years nor more than forty years, at least seven years of which shall be served without benefit of parole, probation, or suspension of sentence, and may, in addition, be required to pay a fine of not more than fifty thousand dollars.
- (c) On a second conviction of an aggregate weight of twenty eight grams or more but less than two hundred fifty grams, imprisonment at hard labor for not less than thirty years nor more than forty years, at least ten years of which shall be served without benefit of parole, probation, or suspension of sentence, and may, in addition, be required to pay a fine of not more than five hundred thousand dollars.
- (d) On a third conviction of an aggregate weight of twenty eight grams or more but less than two hundred fifty grams, imprisonment at hard labor for not less than ninety-nine years without benefit of parole, probation, or suspension of sentence, and may, in addition, be required to pay a fine of not more than five hundred thousand dollars.
- (e) On conviction of an aggregate weight of two hundred fifty grams or more, life imprisonment at hard labor, at least twenty-five years of which shall be served without benefit of parole, probation, or suspension of sentence.
- (b) (f)(i) If the offender unlawfully distributes or dispenses fentanyl or a mixture or substance containing a detectable amount of fentanyl or its analogues, or carfentanil or a mixture or substance containing a detectable amount of carfentanil or its analogues, which the direct cause of serious bodily injury to the person who ingested or consumed the substance, the offense shall be classified as a crime of violence, and the offender shall be imprisoned at hard labor for not less than an additional period of five years nor more than forty years. At least five years of the sentence of imprisonment shall be imposed without benefit of probation, parole, or suspension of sentence. In addition, the offender may be required to pay a fine of not more than fifty thousand dollars. The additional penalty imposed pursuant to this Subparagraph shall be served consecutively to the sentence imposed under Paragraph (4) of this Subsection.
- (ii) For purposes of this Subparagraph, "serious bodily injury" shall have the same meaning as provided by R.S. 14:2(C).
- (iii) This Subsection shall be known and may be cited as "Millie's Law".

The court may order the division of probation and parole of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections to conduct a presentence investigation, or may order the defendant to obtain a substance abuse evaluation, for the purpose of determining whether the defendant has a substance abuse disorder.

- D.(1) On or after July 1, 2020, a detention screening instrument, as provided in Children's Code Article 815, shall be administered for any child placed in secure detention when taken into custody without a court order pursuant to Children's Code Article 814 for alleged commission of a delinquent act.
- (2)(a) The Louisiana Juvenile Detention Alternatives Initiative Statewide Leadership Collaborative, created by House Concurrent Resolution No. 102 of the 2016 Regular Session of the Legislature, hereinafter referred to as "the JDAI Collaborative" shall support the statewide implementation of detention screening instruments and the training process and requirements for those persons who will utilize the instruments.
- (b) The detention screening instruments shall assess the child only to determine the child's risk to public safety while a current arrest is pending and the risk of failure to appear in court for the pending case.
- (c) Except as authorized in Subparagraph (d) of this Paragraph, the The detention screening instrument shall be selected from the tools that are being utilized as of January 1, 2019, by local jurisdictions in the state, which shall be provided by the JDAI Collaborative. A detention screening instrument that is being utilized by a jurisdiction as of January 1, 2019, is sufficient to satisfy the requirements of this Subparagraph.
- (d) Any jurisdiction that chooses to use a detention screening instrument other than an instrument provided by the JDAI Collaborative, shall submit the instrument to the JDAI Collaborative for its approval no later than April 1, 2020, pursuant to a submission process set forth by the JDAI Collaborative.
- (3) A copy of the completed detention screening instrument shall be provided to the juvenile detention facility for any child who is admitted into its custody. The juvenile detention facility shall keep a record of the results of the detention screening instrument and the recommendation made based upon the instrument to either detain the child, release the child with conditions, or release the child without conditions. This record shall include the parish in which the child was taken into custody, the most serious charge for which the child was taken into custody, and demographic information about the child including but not limited to race, ethnicity, gender, and age. This information shall be aggregated and submitted quarterly to the Louisiana Commission on Law Enforcement and Administration of

Criminal Justice which shall annually provide such information to the JDAI Collaborative.

E. Each juvenile detention facility licensed pursuant to this Section Part, including facilities owned or operated by any governmental, profit, nonprofit, private, or public agency, may establish arts-based programming in the facility which may include but is not limited to performing arts, visual arts, and other arts activities that enhance youth development. For the purposes of funding the arts-based programming, the facility owner or operator is authorized to receive, by appropriation, gift, grant, donation, or otherwise, any sum of money, aid, or assistance from any person, firm, or corporation or from the United States, its agencies, the state of Louisiana, or any political subdivision of the state.

H. On or before July 1, 2013, all juvenile detention facilities, including facilities owned or operated by any governmental, profit, nonprofit, private, or public agency, shall be licensed in accordance with rules promulgated pursuant to the provisions of Subsection G of this Section. The Department of Children and Family Services shall be responsible for licensing and regulating juvenile detention facilities until July 1, 2024, when the licensing authority is transferred to the office of juvenile justice pursuant to R.S. 15:1110.3.

If one-sixth of the total admitted assets of the payer are in qualifying Louisiana investments, then the offset shall be sixty-six and two-thirds percent of the amount otherwise assessed; if at least one-fifth of the total admitted assets of the payer are in qualifying Louisiana investments, then the offset shall be seventy-five percent of the amount otherwise assessed; if at least one-fourth of the total admitted assets of the payer are in qualifying Louisiana investments, the offset shall be eighty-five percent of the amount otherwise assessed; and if at least one-third of the total admitted assets of the payer are in qualifying Louisiana investments, then the offset shall be ninety-five percent of the amount otherwise assessed. If the total of the net premium tax liability and the assessment for the expenses of the Department of Insurance paid for the previous year was less than the offset allowed under Item (3)(b)(ii) of this Subsection for the

previous year, the member company may reduce its assessment payment to the Louisiana Insurance Guaranty Association for the current year by that difference.

* * *

- (b)(i) Issue to each insurer paying an assessment under this Part a certificate of contribution, in a form prescribed by the commissioner, for the amount so paid up to but not exceeding one-half of the maximum assessment. All outstanding certificates shall be of equal dignity and priority without reference to amounts or dates of issue.
- (ii) A certificate of contribution issued to a member company may be offset against its premium tax liability in an amount not to exceed ten percent of the assessment for the year in which the assessment was paid in full and not to exceed ten percent of the assessment per year for each of the nine calendar years following the year in which such the assessment was paid in full, not to exceed a total offset of one hundred percent for each assessment. During the calendar year of issuance of a certificate of contribution, and yearly thereafter, a member shall at its option have the right to show a certificate of contribution as an asset in the form approved by the commissioner at percentages of the original face amount approved by the commissioner, equal to the unused offset as of each such calendar year.

- (c)(i) After June 30, 2020, From July 1, 2020, through July 31, 2023, "child" means any person under the age of twenty-one, including an emancipated minor, who commits a delinquent act on or after July 1, 2020, through July 31, 2023, and before the person attains eighteen years of age.
- (ii) Notwithstanding Item (i) of this Subparagraph, a child who has attained the age of seventeen shall be subject to criminal jurisdiction pursuant to Article 305 or 857.
- (d) Beginning August 1, 2023, "child" means any person under the age of twenty-one, including an emancipated minor, who commits a delinquent act on or after August 1, 2023, when the act is not a crime of violence as defined in R.S. 14:2, and the act occurs before the person attains eighteen years of age.
- (e) "Child" includes any person alleged to have committed any delinquent act prior to his seventeenth birthday.

- (C) The provisions of Sections 3 and 4 of this Act shall become effective on July 1, 2026, or the day after the commissioner of administration and the legislative auditor report to the legislature that the transition is complete, whichever is earlier."
