(i) Notwithstanding any provisions of Item(a)(iii) of this Paragraph to the contrary and in conformity with the provisions of R.S. 11:2214(2)(b), "employee" shall mean any person employed by the Baton Rouge Police Department who is a law enforcement employee and "employee" shall not mean any person employed by the Baton Rouge Police Department who is not a law enforcement employee. For purposes of this Subparagraph, "law enforcement employee" means any person occupying a position within a class title that, subject to the merger agreement, was included in the membership of the system on the effective date of this Subparagraph, For any position in the Baton Rouge Police Department within a class title created after the effective date of this Subparagraph, "law enforcement employee" shall mean a person occupying a position that makes the person eligible to receive state supplemental pay.

(j) Any person who is not a full-time police officer and who on March 5, 2023, met this definition of employee only under Item

(a)(iii) of this Paragraph and was enrolled in another municipal retirement system is not an employee.

§2214.1. Termination of membership; certain elected officials

A member of this system who is elected, who is eligible for retirement from this system, and who is eligible for the same employment, for membership in another statewide retirement system may terminate his membership in this system upon his enrollment in the other system. If such member enrolls in another system, he shall file a notice of such enrollment in writing with the board of this system, and all employer and employee contributions to this system by or on behalf of the member shall cease upon receipt by the board of the notice. The former member may apply for retirement from this system and receive this retirement benefit any time after the termination of his membership in this system regardless of whether he terminates the employment that made him eligible for membership.

AMENDMENT NO. 4

(2)(a)(i) Regardless Except as provided by Item (ii) of this Subparagraph, regardless of age, if a retiree of this system becomes an employee as defined in R.S. 11:2213, payment of retirement benefits shall be suspended and the employee and employer shall contribute to the system toward creditable service.

(ii) The benefits of a retiree of the system who retires as a police officer during the period beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2026, and who, no sooner than ninety days following the date of his retirement, is first employed as an employee under R.S 11:2213(11)(a)(iii) shall not be suspended if the retiree irrevocably elects not to receive additional service credit or accrue any additional retirement benefit in the retirement system. Such election shall be in writing and filed with the board of trustees within thirty days after the effective date of the retiree's employment. During such employment, the retiree and his employer shall make contributions to the retirement system as provided by this Chapter. Upon termination of employment as an employee under R.S. 11:2213(11)(a)(iii), employee contributions paid since reemployment shall, upon application, be refunded without interest, to the retiree. retirement system shall retain the employer contributions and interest on the contributions.

Any person retiring under this Paragraph shall provide sufficient documentation to the retirement system proving that he meets these requirements and shall irrevocable elect not to receive additional service credit or accrue any additional retirement benefit in the retirement system if he subsequently becomes reemployed. Such election shall be in writing and filed with the board of trustees before the effective date of the retiree's retirement. During any subsequent employment, the retiree and his employer shall make contributions to the retirement system as provided by this Chapter. Upon termination of subsequent employment, employee contributions paid since reemployment shall, upon application, be refunded, without interest, to the retiree. The retirement system shall retain the employer contributions and interest of the contributions.

Participant contributions may be made by employer pick-up in accordance with the provisions of Section 414(h)(2) of the United States Internal Revenue Code or any amendment thereto. The entirety of each participant's contribution, less the participant's share of any monthly fee established by the board to cover the cost of administration and maintenance of the optional retirement plan, shall be remitted to the appropriate designated company or companies for application to the participant's contract or contracts.

(4) Beginning July 1, 2026, in addition to any contributions otherwise required to be submitted to the Teachers' Retirement System of Louisiana pursuant to this Subsection, each employer shall contribute to the Teachers' Retirement System of Louisiana on behalf of each participant in the optional retirement plan the employer's share of any monthly fee established by the board to cover the cost of administration and maintenance of the optional retirement plan. The Teachers' Retirement System of Louisiana shall retain the contribution to cover the cost of administration and maintenance of the optional retirement plan.

- F.(1) Any monthly fee established by the board to cover the cost of administration and maintenance of the optional retirement plan shall be expressed as a percentage of the participant's earnable compensation. The participant's share of the monthly fee shall be the lesser of:
 - (a) One-half of the total monthly fee.
- (b) Five-hundredths of one percent of the participant's earnable compensation.
- (2) The employers share of the monthly fee shall be the balance remaining after payment of the participant's share.

- B.(1) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, any active contributing participant in the optional retirement plan whose first employment making him eligible for participation in the optional retirement plan occurred on or after August 1, 2020, and who, notwithstanding participation in the optional retirement plan, is otherwise eligible for membership in the regular retirement plan of the Teachers' Retirement System of Louisiana may make an irrevocable election to become a member of the regular retirement plan of the Teachers' Retirement System of Louisiana. The election shall be made in writing in a manner prescribed by the system and shall be received by the retirement system within five years of the participant's first employment making him eligible for participation in the optional retirement plan.
- (2) For a participant making the election, all contributions to the optional retirement plan from the participant and from his employer shall cease on the last day of the month following the month in which the system receives the election. Beginning the first day of the following month, the participant shall begin contributing to and accruing benefits in the regular retirement plan of the Teachers' Retirement System of Louisiana as a member first eligible for membership in a state system on that date. The person's employing agency shall pay the system the contributions required to R.S. 11:102."

AMENDMENT NO. 10

"D. If any participant making an election to become a member of the regular retirement plan of the Teachers' Retirement System of Louisiana has, at the time of such election, prior service in the regular retirement plan, the prior service shall be used for calculation of benefits only and shall not be used to attain eligibility for any
