§62. Employee contribution rates established

Employee contributions to state and statewide public retirement systems shall be paid at the following rates, except as otherwise provided by law:

* * *

(6) Municipal Police Employees' Retirement System:

* * *

(c) For members of Plan C - 0%.

* * *

§103. Employer contributions; determination; statewide systems

* * *

B.(1) Except as provided in Subsection C and Paragraph (E)(2) of this Section, for each fiscal year beginning with Fiscal Year 1989-1990, for each statewide retirement system, the employer contribution rate shall equal the actuarially required employer contribution as determined under Paragraph (3) of this Subsection, divided by the total projected payroll of all active members of the particular system for the fiscal year. Active member payroll shall include participants in the Deferred Retirement Option Plan, but only if direct employer contributions are made based on salaries for such participants.

* * *

E.(1) For the Municipal Police Employees' Retirement System, for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2014, all amortization credit and charge bases existing as of June 30, 2014, shall be combined, offset, and reamortized over a twenty-year period with level payments commencing July 1, 2014.

(2) For the Municipal Police Employees' Retirement System, beginning on June 30, 2027, the employer contribution rate applied to payroll members of Plan C shall not exceed the cost of administering the plan and shall be evaluated at least annually, and the board of trustees in consultation with its actuary shall set a lower rate not to exceed actuarial cost. Beginning with the June 30, 2028, valuation and as part of the valuation process, the actuary shall determine and advise the board whether the experience of Plan C is sufficient to warrant adjusting the employer contribution rate, but at no time shall the rate exceed the cost of administering the plan.

An employer, as defined in R.S. 11:2213, that covers its employees under the federal Social Security program and which has not

previously and specifically excluded its police officers from coverage under this federal program may, by adoption of an ordinance on or before June 30, 2027, make an irrevocable election not to have its employees, as defined in R.S. 11:2213, subject to the provisions of R.S. 11:157 and to instead have all of its employees enroll in Plan C as provided in R.S. 11:2243.1 through 2243.4 or enrolled in the Hazardous Duty Subplan as provided in R.S. 11:2241.1 through 2241.8.

* * *

§2243.1. Plan C

A. Plan C is created as a subplan within the Municipal Police Employees' Retirement System for eligible employees of any employer that covers the employees under the federal Social Security program and which has not previously and specifically excluded its police officers from coverage under this federal program.

B. Any other provisions of this Chapter or any other laws to the contrary notwithstanding, the benefits of Plan C members shall be governed by the provisions of this Part; however, if provisions of this Chapter cover matters not specifically addressed by the provisions of this Part or if any of the provisions of this Chapter are made applicable in this Part, then those provisions shall apply to members governed by this Part.

§2243.2. Application; definitions

Terms not specifically defined in this Section shall have the meanings provided in R.S. 11:2213, unless a different meaning is clearly required by the context. For the purposes of this Part:

(1) "Employer" or "Plan C employer" means either of the following:

(a) An employer, as defined in R.S. 11:2213, that covers its employees under the federal Social Security program that has made an irrevocable election in accordance with R.S. 11:157.2 to enroll all of its employees who would otherwise be eligible for membership in the applicable subplan provided for in Part II or III of this Chapter in this subplan.

(b) An employer, as defined in R.S. 11:2213, that covers its employees under the federal Social Security program that employs a member who has made an irrevocable election in accordance with R.S. 11:157 to be a member of this subplan in lieu of membership in the applicable subplan provided for in Part II or III of this Chapter.

(2) "Member" means any employee of a Plan C employer or any employee who made an election under R.S. 11:157 to be a member of this subplan.

(3) "Subplan" means Plan C created by this Part.

(4) "System" means the Municipal Police Employees' Retirement System.

§2243.3. Disability retirement

A.(1) Eligibility for disability benefits, procedures for application for disability benefits, procedures for the certification of continuing eligibility for disability benefits, the authority of the board of trustees to modify disability benefits, and procedures governing the restoration to active service of an employee who formerly had a disability shall be as provided in R.S. 11:202 through 225.

(2) The burden of proving that a disability is not based on a preexisting condition, prohibiting receipt of benefits, shall lie with the employee if the physical examination and waiver forms required by R.S. 11:2214(A)(2) have not been submitted to the system.

B.(1) The board of trustees shall award disability benefits to eligible members who have been officially certified as disabled to perform the position held by the member at the time that the disability was incurred or as disabled to perform any other position paying the same salary currently available in the department if the disability is not the result of a preexisting condition. Upon receipt of any application for disability retirement, the system shall request from the chief of police the job descriptions of all positions currently available in the department paying the same salary. Such job descriptions shall be submitted to the system within thirty days, or it shall be presumed that no position is available that pays the same salary. The disability benefit shall be determined as provided in this Section.

(2) Upon application for retirement due to a total and permanent disability caused solely as the result of injuries sustained in the performance of his official duties, a member shall receive a disability benefit equal to two and three-quarters percent of his average final compensation multiplied by his years of creditable service, but not less than thirty-three percent nor more than fifty-five percent of his average final compensation.

C.(1) Any disability retiree who is in a coma or who is paraplegic, when such condition is solely the result of injuries sustained in the performance of his official duties and such condition is certified by the State Medical Disability Board shall receive a benefit equal to his average final compensation.

(2) Any disability retiree who is blinded or who loses the total use of a limb solely as a result of injuries sustained in the performance of his official duties and whose condition is certified by the State Medical Disability Board shall receive a benefit equal to his average final compensation.

D. Notwithstanding the provisions of R.S. 11:221(D), any disability benefits granted under the provisions of this Section shall not be reduced because the disability retiree is also receiving social security disability benefits.

§2243.4. Survivor benefits

A. Benefits shall be payable to any survivor of a member of this subplan who dies while in the service or a disability retiree who dies after retirement as a result of injuries sustained in the line of duty as specified in this Section.

B. If an eligible member or disability retiree dies and leaves a surviving spouse, the surviving spouse shall receive a benefit equal to one hundred percent of the member's average final compensation less any survivor benefits payable to a surviving child or children as provided in this Section. The sum of survivor benefits paid to surviving children and a surviving spouse shall not exceed one hundred percent of the member's average final compensation.

C.(1) If an eligible member or disability retiree dies and leaves, in addition to a surviving spouse, one or more surviving children, each surviving child shall be paid monthly benefits equal to ten percent of the deceased member's average final compensation, or two hundred dollars per month, whichever is greater. However, benefits payable on account of each surviving child, when added to the benefits payable to the surviving spouse, shall not exceed an aggregate of one hundred percent of the deceased member's average final compensation.

(2) If an eligible member or disability retiree dies and does not leave a surviving spouse but leaves one or more surviving children, each surviving child shall be paid a monthly benefit equal to twenty-five percent of the deceased member's average final compensation. Benefits paid on account of each surviving child shall not exceed an aggregate of fifty percent of the average final compensation. If the deceased member is survived by only one surviving child, the

surviving child shall be paid not less than thirty percent of the deceased member's average final compensation.

(3) If at the time of death the member or disability retiree is not married to the natural parent of any surviving child or children who are entitled to receive a payment pursuant to this Section and if a trust has been created by the deceased member or disability retiree for the benefit of such surviving child or children, the payment shall be made to any person designated as a trustee by the member or disability retiree on a certified copy of a trust document submitted to the system by the member or disability retiree."

(b) Beginning January 1, 2026, "earnable compensation", shall not include any nonrecurring lump-sum payment or ad hoc bonus, including but not limited to recruitment incentives, hiring or signing bonuses, retention incentives or bonuses, clothing allowance, and any other one-time award not paid as part of the employee's regular recurring salary.

* * *

§2218. Creditable service

* * *

K.(1) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, any member of this system who was employed by any other law enforcement agency of the state of Louisiana or any political subdivision thereof, if such service is not creditable in any public retirement or pension system, fund, or plan in the state, may purchase service credit in this system by paying all actuarial costs of such purchase as determined by the retirement system actuary in accordance with R.S. 11:158(C). The member shall pay the cost of such service credit either in a lump sum, or the member may enter into an installment agreement with the system, on terms established by the system, for payments over a period not to exceed sixty months, inclusive of interest at the actuarially assumed rate of return. Notwithstanding the foregoing, any outstanding balance shall be paid in full no later than thirty days prior to the member's effective retirement date or the date on which the member first receives a benefit from the system, whichever is earlier.

(2)(a) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, any person who has at least six months of service credit in this system and who was employed by any law enforcement agency of the federal government or of any other state or of any political subdivision of another state where such service is not creditable in any public retirement or pension system, fund, or plan, in this or any other state or of the federal government, may purchase service credit in this system for such employment by paying all actuarial costs of such purchase as determined by the retirement system actuary, in accordance with R.S. 11:158(C) and as further provided in this Paragraph.

(b) To purchase credit for such service, the member shall apply to the system and furnish with such application information on the name and address of each retirement or pension system, plan, or fund in which the member was enrolled during the out-of-state or federal law enforcement employment, together with the dates of such employment. The appropriate officer, trustee, or employee of each system, plan, or fund or of the out-of-state or federal employing agency shall certify the length of employment of the member and that the member does not have retirement or pension credit for such employment which duplicates the service credit being purchased in the system.

(c) The cost of such service credit shall be paid in a lump sum, or the member may enter into an installment agreement with the system, on terms established by the system, for payments over a period not to exceed sixty months, inclusive of interest at the actuarially assumed rate of return. Notwithstanding the foregoing, any outstanding balance shall be paid in full no later than thirty days prior to the member's effective retirement date or the date on which the member is to first receive a benefit from the system, whichever is earlier.

* * *

§2220.1. Survivor benefits for officers killed in the line of duty; failure of employer enrollment

A. Notwithstanding any provision of this Chapter to the contrary, a surviving spouse or other eligible beneficiary of an employee as defined in R.S. 11:2213(11) who was killed in the line of duty while employed as a municipal police officer on or after July 1, 2010, and before March 1, 2026, may apply for survivor benefits under this Chapter no later than June 30, 2027, if the employee otherwise met the eligibility requirements for membership in the system at the time of death.

B. If the surviving spouse or beneficiary otherwise qualifies for survivor benefits, the system shall pay such benefits notwithstanding the failure of the employer to enroll the officer in the system at the time of death. Any person who would have been eligible to receive a benefit but whose benefit payments would have ceased before the effective date of this Section shall be paid the benefits to which the person would have been entitled.

C. Any actuarial cost associated with benefits paid pursuant to this Section shall be funded with additional employer contributions.

D. Any retroactive benefits payable pursuant to this Section shall be paid no later than three months after the system determines that the applicant is eligible.

(b) For any fiscal year beginning on or after July 1, 2028, in which the rate determined under R.S. 11:103 decreases, the additional benefits funding rate shall increase by the lesser of one-half of the amount of the decrease in the rate determined under R.S. 11:103 or the amount necessary for the additional benefits funding rate to equal two and one-half percent. Any increase in the additional benefits funding rate shall be permanent.

(c) For any fiscal year beginning on or after July 1, 2028, in which the sum of the rate determined under R.S. 11:103 and the additional benefits funding rate does not exceed twenty-nine and thirty-five hundredths percent, the applicable additional benefits funding rate shall be equal to the additional benefits funding rate.

(d) For any fiscal year beginning on or after July 1, 2028, in which the sum of the rate determined under R.S. 11:103 and the additional benefits funding rate exceeds twenty-nine and thirty-five hundredths percent the applicable additional benefits funding rate shall be equal to the greater of eighty-five hundredths of one

percentage point and the difference between twenty-nine and thirty-five hundredths percent and the rate determined under R.S. 11:103.

(4)(a) For any fiscal year ending on or before June 30, 2028, in which the board of trustees sets the direct employer contribution rate higher than the rate determined under R.S. 11:103, excess contributions resulting from the higher rate shall be used as provided in Paragraph (C)(1) of this Section or transferred to the account as provided in Paragraph (C)(2) of this Section.

(b) For any fiscal year, beginning on or after July 1, 2028, in which the board of trustees sets the direct employer contribution rate higher than the rate determined under R.S. 11:103, excess contributions resulting from the higher rate shall be credited to the account to be used solely to pay additional benefits to retirees, survivors, and beneficiaries.

C.(1) Except as provided in Paragraph (2) of this Subsection, any excess contributions for any fiscal year ending on or before June 30, 2028, resulting from the board's exercise of its authority pursuant to Paragraph (B)(1) of this Section shall be applied, until exhausted, exclusively to reduce the outstanding balance of the oldest positive amortization base; however, the future payments for such amortization base shall continue to be made according to the original amortization schedule established in compliance with the requirements of Article X, Section 29(E)(3) of the Constitution of Louisiana and R.S. 11:103 until the outstanding balance is fully liquidated.

(2) For any fiscal year ending on or before June 30, 2028, the board of trustees may dedicate a specific amount of excess contributions, up to the amount generated by setting the rate equal to eighty-five hundredths of one percentage point more than the rate determined under R.S. 11:103, to be used solely to pay additional benefits to retirees, survivors, and beneficiaries. The dedicated amount of funds shall be credited to the account.

F. This Section shall be construed to promote humane treatment of animals, preserve local governmental flexibility, and avoid unnecessary regulatory burden."
