(b)(i) After expiration of the deadline to submit an LOI for a single award ID/IQ construction phase contract, the authority shall issue "request for proposals", hereafter referred to in this Section as "RFP", to contractors that submit an LOI. The RFP shall include instructions for development and submittal of proposals, a description of how proposals shall be evaluated, and shall comply with the requirements of this Section.

(ii) After expiration of the deadline to submit an LOI for multiple award ID/IQ construction phase contract, the authority shall issue a request for qualifications, hereafter referred to in this Section as "RFQ", to contractors that submit an LOI. The RFQ shall include instructions for development and submission of qualifications, a description of how qualifications shall be evaluated, and shall comply with the requirements of this Section.

(c) Bid security required by R.S. 38:2218 or by the authority shall be specified in the"

(d) The proposals and statements of qualification received by the authority and the evaluation committee's records, including the evaluations committee's findings, grading, score sheets, and recommendations, shall not be public records until the ID/IQ construction phase contract has been entered into or the procurement has been cancelled. The meetings of the evaluation committee shall not be subject to the Open Meetings Law.

(5) Prior to issuing a work order pursuant to a multiple award ID/IQ construction phase contract, the authority shall request, in writing, bids from the contractors awarded the contract. The authority shall issue the work order to the lowest responsive bidder."

J. For benchmark categories designated by rule or guidance as bone marrow transplant, cellular therapy, cell-therapy, gene-therapy, or other highly specialized modalities, the department shall establish specialized process standards, in consultation with research entities conducting such trials, that account for the clinical urgency, specialized infrastructure, relevant subspecialty expertise, and operational requirements of such categories."
