Legislator calls for community comments on school safety

BATON ROUGE - State Representative John Schroder, R-Covington, who chairs the Select Committee on Homeland Security, wants to hear directly from educators and parents about school safety.

Rep. Schroder, whose committee held a hearing last month to learn about the status of the safety of schools in Louisiana, said he now wants to and hear from educators and parents on what they want. "Those are the voices being left out of the conversation," he said. "I'm asking parents, educators and administrators from across the state to contact my office directly with their concerns and suggestions. We need to hear from them."
