Acadiana Delegation Elects Officers

BATON ROUGE – State Representative Mike Huval, R-Breaux Bridge, has been re-elected as Chairman of the Acadiana Legislative Delegation for 2018.

Huval represents House District 46, which includes parts of St. Martin, St. Landry and Iberia parishes. He is vice-chairman of the Municipal, Parochial and Cultural Affairs Committee and is a member of the Ways and Means and Joint Capital Outlay committees.

Joining Huval in the delegation's executive offices are Vice-Chairman Sen. Jonathan Perry, R-Kaplan, and Secretary-Treasurer Rep. Johnny Berthelot, R-Gonzales.
