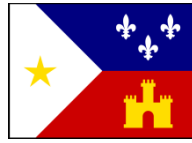

ACADIANA DELEGATION ELECTS OFFICERS

BATON ROUGE, La. – The Acadiana Delegation of the Louisiana Legislature has elected its officers for 2025. State Representative Beau Beaulieu will serve as Chair for the second year in a row. Beaulieu represents House District 48 including Iberia, Lafayette, and St. Martin Parishes.
