such personnel employed by the local school system beginning Fiscal Year 1998-1999 shall be equal to \$34,991 per year, or as much of \$34,991 as may be accomplished with 100% of expenditures supported by this appropriation; and, thereafter, any remaining funds shall be available for expenditure by each local school system for other lawful purposes. \$ 71,797,339

Provided, however, that as used in this Schedule, "classroom teacher" shall mean teachers assigned the professional activities of instructing pupils in courses in classroom situations for which daily pupil attendance figures for the school system are kept."
