- On a request in writing or by telephone, with proper identification provided by the consumer, a consumer reporting

agency shall place a security alert on the consumer's file not later than five business days after the date the agency receives the request. The security alert must remain in effect for not less than ninety days after the date the agency places the security alert on file. There is no limit on the number of security alerts a consumer may request. At the termination of the security alert, upon written request or telephone authorization by the consumer, and with proper identification provided by the consumer, the agency shall provide the consumer with a copy of the consumer's file.

- A consumer reporting agency shall send an alert to each person who requests a consumer report if a security alert is in effect for the consumer file involved regardless of whether a full credit report, or summary report is requested.
- K. A consumer reporting agency that compiles and maintains files on a nationwide basis, as defined by 15 U.S.C. §1681a(p) shall maintain a toll-free telephone number that will accept security alert requests from consumers twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week, subject to reasonable maintenance, or service outages beyond the control of the consumer reporting agency.

- (1) A check services or fraud prevention services company, which issues reports on incidents of fraud or authorizations for the purpose of approving or processing negotiable instruments, electronic funds transfers, or similar methods of payments.
- (2) A deposit account information service company, which issues reports regarding account closures due to fraud, substantial overdrafts, ATM abuse, or similar negative information regarding a consumer, to inquiring banks or other financial institutions for use only in reviewing a consumer request for a deposit account at the inquiring bank or financial institution.
- (3) A reseller of credit information that assembles or merges information contained in the database of another consumer reporting agency or multiple consumer reporting agencies, and does not maintain a permanent database of credit information from which new consumer reports are produced.
- Any database or file which consists solely of any information adverse to the interests of the consumer, including but not limited to criminal record information, which is used for fraud prevention or detection, tenant screening, employment screening, or any purpose permitted by the federal Fair Credit Reporting Act, 15 U.S.C. §1681b.

**HB 350 THOMPSON**—MTR VEHICLE/OFFICE: Requires the office of motor vehicles to collect certain statistical information

**HB 459 E ALEXANDER** — HIGHWAYS: Designates a portion of Louisiana Highway 3073 as a parkway

**HB 536 BOWLER** — MOTOR VEHICLES: Requires the office of state police to adopt guidelines for seat belt and motor vehicle liability security checkpoints

**HB 605 DIEZ** — CONTRACTS: Authorizes the department to construct the New Mississippi River Bridge at St. Francisville using the design-build method

**HB 632 DIEZ** — MTR VEHICLE/VIOLATIONS: Provides relative to penalties for convictions of certain commercial motor vehicle violations

**HB 713 HUTTER** — MTR VEHICLE/SEAT BELTS: Requires child passenger restraint systems, according to age and weight, for children transported in motor vehicles

**HB 716 SCHWEGMANN** — MTR VEHICLE/MOTORCYCLES : Requires any person who operates or rides upon a motorcycle to wear a safety helmet

**HB 769 DIEZ** — MTR VEHICLE/DRIVER LIC: Provides for the renewal of an expired Class "D" or "E" license by mail or electronic commerce under certain circumstances

**HB 771 FUTRELL** — MTR VEHICLE/SEAT BELTS: Provides that every occupant in certain vehicles shall wear a safety belt

**HB 1339 GLOVER** — HIGHWAYS: Names a portion of La. Hwy 3132 in Caddo Parish as Terry Bradshaw Passway

**HB 1365 PINAC** — CONTRACTORS/CONSTRUCTION: Requires contractors to actively work on contracts let by the Department of Transportation and Development

**HB 1690 DIEZ** — TRANSPORTATION DEPT: Authorizes loans from bank to fund approved Department of Transportation and Development eligible infrastructure projects of public entities

**HB 1777 DAMICO** — MTR VEHICLE/INSPECTION: Increases the additional fee for motor vehicle inspections conducted in certain parishes
