Senate Bill No. 1 of the 2024 Third Extraordinary Session by Senator Morris, proposes to amend Article V, Sections 5(B), 15(A), and 16(A) of the Constitution of Louisiana.

SB 1 amends the Constitution of Louisiana to allow the Louisiana Supreme Court the authority to discipline an attorney not licensed in the state of Louisiana. Additionally, SB 1 grants the legislature the authority to establish trial courts of limited or specialized jurisdiction.
