To amend and reenact R.S. 6:314(E), R.S. 9:1515(C) and (D), and R.S. 47:2437, relative to taxes; to repeal from certain provisions of law references to a previously repealed inheritance tax; to repeal certain notification requirements relating to a previously repealed inheritance tax; to make technical changes; and to provide for related matters.

To amend and reenact R.S. 40:967.1, relative to controlled dangerous substances; to provide for the unlawful distribution of fentanyl under certain circumstances; to provide for a penalty; and to provide for related matters.

To amend and reenact R.S. 40:1379.3(N)(11) and to enact R.S. 14:95(A)(4)(b)(iv) and (J), relative to the carrying of weapons; to provide for an exception to the illegal carrying of weapons; to provide for an exception to the prohibited locations where a concealed handgun cannot be carried; and to provide for related matters.

AN ACT

To enact Civil Code Article 138, relative to modification of child custody; to provide for the modification of custody under certain circumstances; to provide for certain evidentiary standards; and to provide for related matters.

To amend and reenact R.S. 15:572(A), 572.4(B)(1)(a) and (3) and (C) through (E), 572.5(B), and 572.6 and to enact 572.4(F) and (G), relative to clemency; to provide relative to notification procedures; to provide relative to the approval or rejection of a favorable recommendation for commutation or pardon; to provide relative to application procedures; to provide relative to clemency hearings; to provide relative to clemency investigations; to provide relative to the finality of clemency determinations; and to provide for related matters.

To enact R.S. 33:4161.2, relative to St. Landry Parish; to provide relative to a stormwater management utility district created by the parish; to provide relative to fees imposed by the district; to provide relative to the collection of fees; and to provide for related matters.

To enact R.S. 17:154.1(D) and 3996(B)(82), relative to schools; to prohibit middle schools and high schools from beginning the instructional day prior to specified start times; to provide for implementation; and to provide for related matters.

AN ACT

To enact R.S. 18:1300.34, relative to video draw poker devices; to authorize the governing authority of East Feliciana Parish to call and conduct a referendum election on a proposition to allow the operation of video draw poker devices in the parish; to provide for procedures for the calling and holding of the election; and to provide for related matters.

To amend and reenact R.S. 15:711 and 832(A), (B), (C)(introductory paragraph) and (2), (D), (E), (G), and (H) and to enact Part I-F of Chapter 7 of Title 15 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be comprised of R.S. 15:748 through 748.4, and R.S. 15:832(I), relative to prisoners; to provide for legislative intent; to create the Incarcerated Individuals Workplace Safety Act; to provide for definitions; to provide for minimum safety requirements for certain workers and work environments; to provide for the establishment of a committee; to provide for duties of the committee; to provide for duties of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections; to provide relative to the assessment of wages; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for related matters.
