D.(1)(a) The fund shall be administered by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education. Subject Except as provided in Subsection E of this Section and subject to legislative appropriation, monies in the fund shall be awarded annually to local entities approved by the board for the purpose of funding projects that will expand the number of early childhood care and education quality slots for families who are eligible for the Child Care Assistance Program in Type III early learning centers that have at least one classroom with children age fifteen months or younger if a local entity provides funds from nonstate and nonfederal sources. No such

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award shall be made unless the local entity's financial commitment to the project proposed for funding provides matching funds from nonstate and nonfederal sources at a rate of at least one-to-one.

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E. Subject to appropriation, monies in the fund shall also be awarded to each public school system that applies for funding and uses the funding solely for the purpose of providing a program pursuant to The Cecil J. Picard LA 4 Early Childhood Program, hereafter referred to in this Section as "LA 4", in accordance with R.S. 17:407.26. The monies in the fund allocated to the LA4 program shall be administered by the state Department of Education.

E:F. Monies from the fund shall not be used to displace, replace, or supplant the amount appropriated to the Child Care Assistance Program.

F.G. The department shall actively solicit and use resources to fund the Child Care Assistance Program slots.

G.H. The State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education shall promulgate rules and regulations to administer the distribution of monies from the fund to the Child Care Assistance Program.

Section 3. R.S. 40:1046.5 is hereby enacted to read as follows: §1046.5. Therapeutic Marijuana Fund

A. There is hereby created, as a special fund in the state treasury, the Therapeutic Marijuana Fund, hereinafter referred to in this Section as the "fund". Monies appropriated or transferred into the fund shall be deposited by the state treasurer after compliance with the requirements of Article VII, Section 9(B) of the Constitution of Louisiana relative to the Bond Security and Redemption Fund. Monies in the fund shall be invested by the treasurer in the same manner as state general fund monies. Interest earned on investment of monies in the fund shall be credited to the fund. Unexpended and unencumbered monies in the fund at the end of the fiscal year shall remain in the fund.

B. Fees collected by the Department of Revenue pursuant to R.S. 40:1046(H) shall be transferred to the treasurer for deposit into the fund. Monies in the fund shall be appropriated as follows:

(1) Two million dollars or two percent, whichever is greater, shall be appropriated and split evenly between the Louisiana State University Agricultural Center and the Southern University Agricultural Center.

(2) The remainder shall be appropriated to the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, office of state police.

(2) The following words shall have the following meanings unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

(a) "Fiber-optic cable equipment" means:

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(i) Telecommunications fiber.

(ii) Wires.

(iii) Poles.

(iv) Supports.

(v) Lashing cable.

(vi) Conduit.

(vii) Communication handholes.

(viii) Customer premise equipment.

(2) As used in this Section, the following terms shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this Paragraph unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

(a) "Broadband communications service" means telecommunications service as defined in 47 U.S.C. 153(53), cable service as defined in 47 U.S.C. 522(6), and internet access service as defined in Section 1101(e)(3)(D) of the Internet Tax Freedom Act (P.L. 105-277, Title XI), as amended, or any combination of these services.

"Communications provider" means a person who is (b) principally engaged in the business of distributing, provisioning, transmitting, conveying, monitoring, switching, receiving, or routing of a broadband communications service.

(c) "Equipment used to provide broadband communications service" and "equipment" means all of the following items when such items are utilized to provide broadband communications service: cables, including fiber-optic and coaxial cables; antennas; towers poles; supports; mounts; lashing wires; conduit; above-ground network equipment enclosures and storage devices; below-ground network equipment enclosures and storage devices; central control headend equipment; hub switching equipment; network monitoring and diagnostic equipment; networking and distribution equipment; radio communication equipment; routing and switching equipment; broadband network software; power regulator equipment; power failure backup equipment; network servers; communications multiplexers; and signal amplification equipment.

(b) (d) "Unserved area" means an area that has service levels below the minimum acceptable level of fixed broadband service as defined in 7 U.S.C. $950b\dot{b}(e)(1)$.

(3) Each item of fiber-optic cable equipment shall be eligible for only a single rebate pursuant to this Section. Subsequent transactions involving the sale or resale of the same item of fiber-optic cable equipment shall not be eligible for this rebate.

(4) The rebate authorized pursuant to this Section shall not be allowed for the purchases of fiber-optic cable equipment that are paid for with state or federal funds, unless the state or federal funds are reported as taxable income or are structured as repayable loans any purchase of equipment that is paid for with state or federal funds.

B.(1) Requests for the rebates of state sales and use taxes pursuant to the provisions of this Section shall be processed by the Department of Revenue. A purchaser shall claim a state rebate using the form and in the manner prescribed by the Department of Revenue.

The purchaser who claims a rebate shall submit (2)documentation to the secretary of the Department of Revenue evidencing the purchase of fiber-optic cable equipment used to provide broadband communications service and documentation evidencing the purchaser is a winning bidder that was awarded a census block by the Federal Communications Commission in the Rural Digital Opportunity Fund Auction.

(3) The secretary of the Department of Revenue may shall promulgate rules in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act as are necessary to implement the provisions of this Section, including rules to provide for the form and manner for claiming a rebate. Such rules shall establish the method for processing and paying rebate claims, including but not limited to a first-come, first-served system, or other method which the department, in its discretion, may find beneficial for administration of the rebate.

C. Requests for the rebate of local sales and use taxes pursuant to the provisions of this Section shall be processed by the appropriate local taxing authority. A purchaser shall claim a local rebate using the form and in the manner required by the local taxing authority. The purchaser who claims the rebate shall submit documentation to the local taxing authority evidencing the purchase of fiber-optic cable equipment and documentation evidencing the purchaser is a winning bidder that was awarded a census block by the Federal Communications Commission in the Rural Digital Opportunity Fund Auction. The Louisiana Uniform Local Sales Tax Board may promulgate rules and regulations in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act as necessary for the implementation of this Section.

C.(1) The total amount of rebates paid pursuant to this Section in any fiscal year shall not exceed fifteen million dollars.

(2)(a) Within the limit established in Paragraph (1) of this Subsection, the amount of rebates paid for purchases of equipment used to provide broadband communications service outside of an unserved area shall not exceed three million dollars in any fiscal year.

(b) The purpose of this Paragraph is to reserve up to eighty percent of the total amount of rebates authorized by this Section as incentives for communications providers to furnish broadband communications service in unserved areas.

(3) If the total amount of rebates requested for a fiscal year exceeds the applicable limit provided in either Paragraph (1) or (2) of this Subsection, the excess shall be treated as having been requested on the first day of the subsequent fiscal year.

D. The Department of Revenue shall not remit payment of any rebate authorized by this Section after June 30, 2027.

Section 2. This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2024; if vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on July 1, 2024, or on the day following such approval by the legislature, whichever is later."
