If an excavator or demolisher is timely notified by the municipality or parish government of its inability to locate, mark, or provide information as to the location of any of its underground utilities or facilities, the excavator or demolisher shall be responsible and liable for any and all damage to the municipality of parish governments underground utility or facility related to the excavation or demolition activity."
