• 36 Positions were moved from Corrections to the Division of Administration due to the Information Technology consolidation; 66 positions, 35 of which are vacant, were eliminated; 24 positions were added for healthcare services and 5 positions were added for workload adjustments, which results in cumulative decrease of 73 authorized positions.



#### **Salaries and Related Benefits**

 Provides funding for performance adjustments and for the salary base. Also, additional funding for increased state retirement rates and health insurance costs.

#### **Supplies**

 Reductions in supplies are used to fund increases in salaries and retirement costs.

#### Other Charges

 Funding allocated for inmate health care services at the individual prison clinics and off-site care for more extensive cases.



#### <u>Issue</u>

 Acquisitions and Major Repairs have been eliminated. Should the agency need to make such purchases, funding will have to be taken from other expenditure categories.




## 7-Year Expenditure History (in millions)












## 7-Year Expenditure History (in millions)

# Significant Adjustments



Provides funding for personnel services, including an additional \$9 million for performance adjustments, \$12.9 million for retirement, \$4.4 million for the Salary Base Adjustment, and \$1.2 million for group insurance.



Provides \$6M in funds from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) that the state is being reimbursed for wind damages from Hurricane Gustav. The funds will come from the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness (GOHSEP) to be used by DOC to cover increased retirement costs. These funds may not be available in the future.



Salaries and Related Benefits funded from other line items. Neutral adjustment that removes (\$6.7M) from Supplies and allocates it to Salaries (\$5.8M) and Related Benefits (\$1.9M).



Position and related funding reduction which includes a loss of 36 T.O. and \$5.4 million associated with the Information Technology consolidation and a 66 T.O. personnel reduction which includes a reduction of 35 vacancies. These adjustments are partially offset by an additional 24 positions placed in various agencies to support medical services and 5 positions added to Avoyelles Correctional Center because of the closure of J. Levy Dabadie Correctional Center.





# Discretionary/Nondiscretionary Funding in FY 14-15 Executive Budget





- 4,704 Authorized Positions (4,638 classified and 66 unclassified)
- 23 full-time non-T.O. positions
- 0 Other Charges positions
- As of 12/27/2013, Corrections had 35 vacancies and all were eliminated
- Projected Turnover Rate is 25% for Security Personnel and 16% for Other Personnel




### **TOTAL FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT (FTE) POSITIONS**


### FY 13 CLASSIFIED AVERAGE ANNUAL PAY PER FTE











# Southern Legislative Conference (SLC) Population/Inmate Comparisons



### **2012** Annual Expenditures Per Inmate



## **Recidivism in SLC States**


### 3-Year Return Rate
