








### 7-Year Expenditure History












### 7-Year Expenditure History (in millions)

# Significant Adjustments



Net increase of \$5,080,837 in total funding primarily due to an increase in Personal Services. (\$373,610 in the Office of the Secretary, \$1,608,255 in the Office of Environmental Compliance, \$1,359,474 in the Office of Environmental Services, and \$2,399,021 in the Office of Management & Finance)



Non-recurs expenditures from BP funds in the Office of Environmental Compliance associated with the Deepwater Horizon oil spill disaster.



Non-recurs funds from the statutorily dedicated Brownfields Revolving Loan Fund in the Office of Environmental Compliance. Loans were provided to private entities for the expansion, redevelopment, or reuse of properties complicated by the presence or potential presence of hazardous substances, pollutants, or contaminants. DEQ expended the program's remaining funds in FY 14.



# Discretionary/Nondiscretionary Funding in FY 14-15 Executive Budget





- Total Personnel Services = \$60.6 million; 86.7% of the Department of Environmental Quality's total Executive Budget Recommendation (excluding Other Charges)
- 691 Authorized Positions (682 classified and 9 unclassified)
- 0 full-time non-T.O. positions
- 0 Other Charges positions
- As of 12/27/2013, the Department of Environmental Quality had 38 vacancies. The Executive Budget eliminates 9 of those vacant positions.




#### **TOTAL FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT (FTE) POSITIONS**


#### FY 13 CLASSIFIED AVERAGE ANNUAL PAY PER FTE
