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Department Functions

Veterans Parish Services Offices

- Maintains a claims assistance office at the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs Regional Office in New Orleans, as well as parish service offices in all 64 parishes.
- Advises and assists Louisiana veterans and their dependents in filing and pursuing claims with the federal VA.

Military Family Assistance Fund

- Addresses financial hardships Louisiana National Guardsmen and Reservists and their dependents may encounter when they are placed on active-duty status.
- Funded by private donations from individuals and corporations.

Educational Institutions and Training Establishments

- There are numerous approved establishments that serve over 5,700 veterans and/or dependents.

Troops to Teachers

- Recruits quality teachers for schools that serve students from low-income families and helps relieve teacher shortages.
- Provides information, advice, and funding to eligible veterans, reservists, and active duty personnel who
 will be leaving active service soon, and want to pursue teaching as a second career.

Veterans Homes

- Provides nursing care to eligible veterans in five veteran nursing homes throughout the state.

Veterans Cemeteries

- Available for qualifying veterans, their spouses, and dependent children .
- No charge for veteran burials.
- LDVA received a construction grant to build a fourth Louisiana Veterans Cemetery in Rayville, Louisiana.
 Opening scheduled for January 2016 .




- The recommended funding in FY 15-16 for the 5 War Veterans Homes makes up over 86.6% of the Department of Veterans Affairs' total recommended funding.

Major Sources of Revenue FY 15-16

Federal Funds - \$39 million

- Federal Funds, in part, are derived from the Veterans Administration for patient care days based on a reimbursement rate of \$102.38 per day, per nursing care veteran housed, and reflected in the daily census.
- Medicare eligible residents cost reimbursements are from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

Fees & Self-Generated Revenue - \$16 million

- Resident fees
- Employee and visitor-purchased meal tickets

Interagency Transfers - \$1.6 million

Federal funds from War Veterans Homes for Medicare services

Salaries & Related Benefits

Reduction of 2 TO positions caused a decrease in salaries. Related Benefits increased primarily due to the department-wide retirement base adjustments, health insurance rate increases, and salary base adjustments for 838 employees.

Other Charges

Increase primarily due to the Department's share of the expenses related to the IT and procurement consolidation; increase in risk management fees; and \$400K in disability claims.




8-Year Expenditure History (in millions)



Significant Adjustments

\$131,350 Federal Funds

Provides increased federal funding of \$26,270 to each of the five War Veterans Homes, based on an increase in the Cost of Living adjustment given by the US Department of Veterans Affairs to each veteran.

\$400,000 SGF

Provides for payment of Louisiana Veterans Disability Claims in the amount of \$100,000 per claimant for four veterans who have met the requirements.

\$152,483 SGF


Provides funding for personnel and operational costs associated with the new Northeast Cemetery (NELA) in Rayville, LA set to open January 2016.

\$138,000 SGF

Reduces discretionary expenditures of travel, supplies, operating services and TO in the Contacts Assistance Program (-\$80K), the Claims Program (-\$48K), and the Administrative Program (-\$10K).

\$553,480 Various MOF

Increase in Federal Funds and Interagency Transfers offset reduction in State General Fund and Fees & Self-Generated Revenue (-\$553,480 SGF, \$206,515 IAT, -\$56,934 FSGR, and \$403,899 FF). Increase in Federal and IAT funds are due to a change in the burial rate, increased burial activity, and increased federal funding for veteran care.



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


FY 15-16 SALARIES/POSITIONS

- \$30.3 million for salaries and other compensation
- \$14.3 million for related benefits
- Total Personnel Services = \$44.6 million
 This is 78.2% of the Veterans Affairs total Executive Budget Recommendation (excluding Other Charges)
- 838 Authorized Positions (829 classified and 9 unclassified)
- 0 full-time non-T.O. positions
- 0 other charges positions
- As of 1/30/2015, there were 50 vacancies and 4 have been eliminated.
 Executive Budget has a net reduction of 2 vacant positions after adding 2 new positions.



TOTAL FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT (FTE) POSITIONS



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FY 14 CLASSIFIED AVERAGE ANNUAL PAY PER FTE


