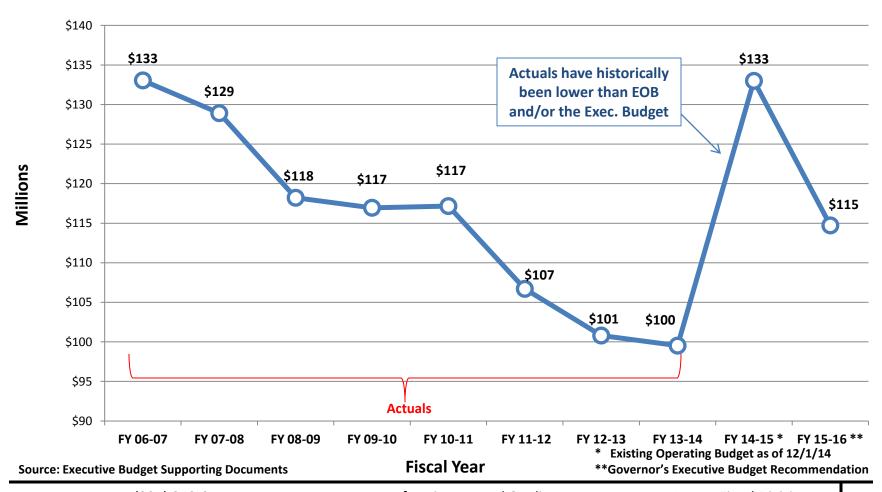

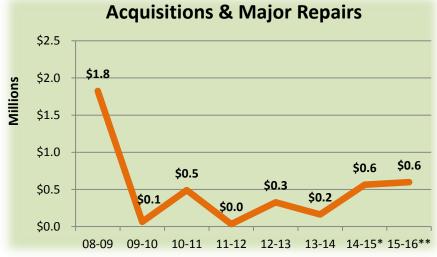


### 8-Year Expenditure History









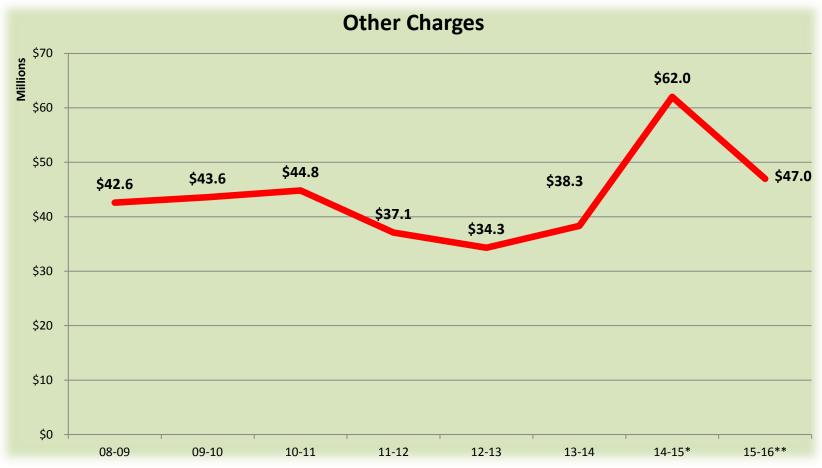

# Significant Adjustments



Annualizes 2015 Mid-Year Reduction Plan (-\$9,908 SGF, -\$2,492,087 SD).



GEMS Savings (-\$24,769 SGF, -\$25,00 IAT, -\$3,710 FSGR, -\$1,852,994 SD).



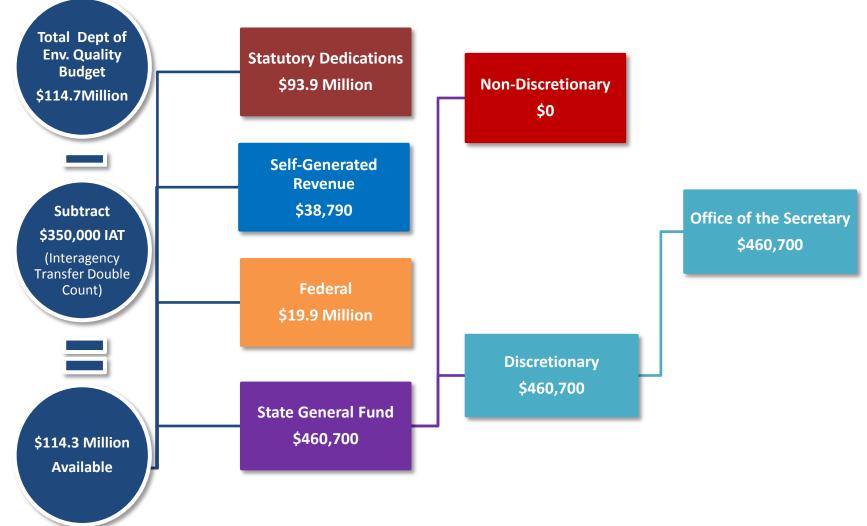
Non-recurs funds from the statutorily dedicated Environmental Trust Fund for expenses associated with the subterranean fire at Harrelson Landfill.



Reduces Statutory Dedications in various expenditure categories to properly align the department's expenditures closer to a 3-year average of actual expenditures. Includes Motor Fuels Trust Fund (-\$5,652,500), Clean Water State Revolving Fund (-\$533,000), and Waste Tire Management Fund (-\$125,000).



# Discretionary/Non-Discretionary Funding in FY 15-16 Executive Budget



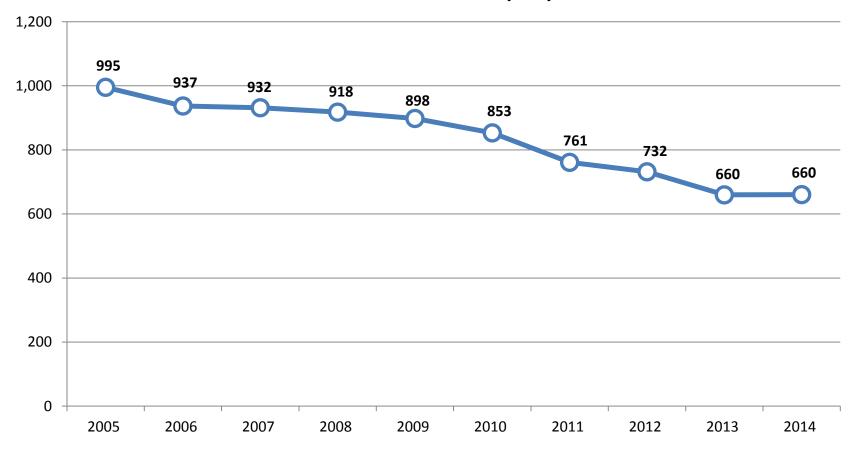


#### **FY 15-16 SALARIES/POSITIONS**

- \$37.8 million for Salaries and Other Compensation
- \$21.8 million for Related Benefits
- Total Personnel Services = \$59.7 million; 88.1% of the Department of Environmental Quality's total Executive Budget Recommendation (excluding Other Charges)
- 677 Authorized Positions (668 classified and 9 unclassified)
- 0 full-time non-T.O. positions
- 0 Other Charges positions
- As of 1/30/2015, DEQ had 13 vacancies. 14 positions are being recommended for elimination, however, funding for 10 positions was eliminated during the mid-year budget cuts on 12/18/2014. Only 4 positions remain to be cut.



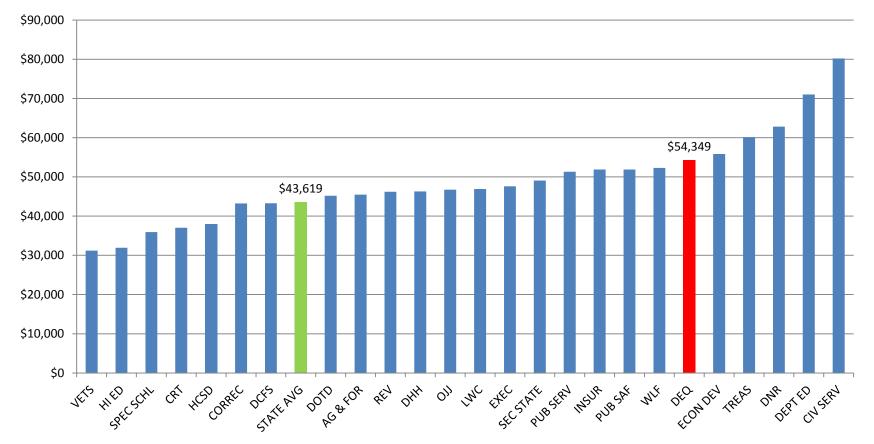
#### **TOTAL FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT (FTE) POSITIONS**

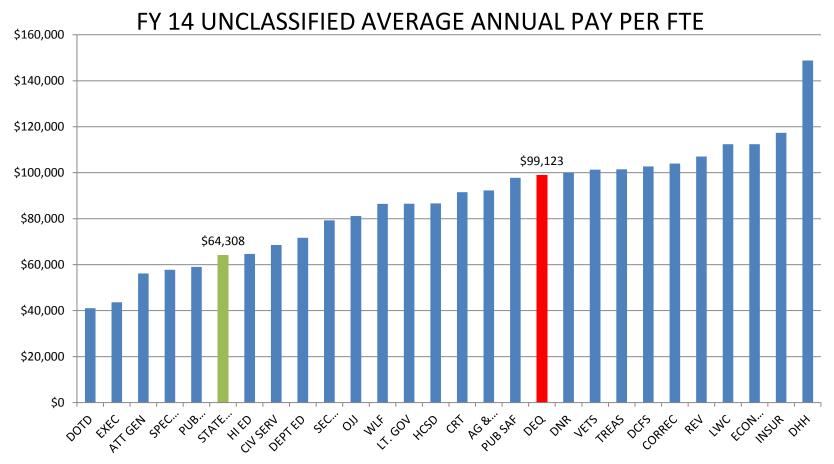


#### FY 14 CLASSIFIED AVERAGE ANNUAL PAY PER FTE
