
Louisiana Rescue Plan Fund

Total Funding = \$1.386 B available

- The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 allocated \$3.011 billion to Louisiana from the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund, which was deposited into the Louisiana Rescue Plan Fund
 - This <u>does not</u> include the \$1.808 billion Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund or the \$179.8 million Coronavirus Capital Projects Fund
- \$1.386 billion remained for FY 23:

Usages and descriptions based on final enacted bills:

1. \$500 M - Unemployment Compensation Fund

- Funds used to replenish the balance and pay unemployment benefits
- 2. \$450 M Water Sector Program grants for repairs, improvements, and consolidation of community water and sewer systems

3. \$334.3 M - Infrastructure Projects

- \$100 M Lake Charles bridge
- \$100 M I-49 South
- \$85.3 M Highway Program
- \$10 M Acadiana Gulf of Mexico Access Channel
- \$25 M DOTD for competitive federal match needs and active cost overruns
- \$12.5 M Baton Rouge/New Orleans rail project
- \$1.5 M Globalplex Dock Access

4. \$100 M - Various Initiatives

- \$27 M Early Childhood Supports and Services Program Fund to reestablish the program within the Department of Health
- \$25 M Workforce Training Rapid Response Fund for the Louisiana Community and Technical College System to expand healthcare workforce training programs
- \$23.7 M Matching Funds Fund for the Departments of Health and Environmental Quality to match required funds for the drinking water and the clean water revolving loan programs
- \$8 M Rural Primary Care Physicians Development Fund for rural physician tuition reimbursements
- \$5 M Fisheries Hurricane Cleanup for the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries to match federal funds to cleanup boats and debris after Hurricane Ida
- \$5 M Reading Enrichment and Academic Deliverables (R.E.A.D.) Program to provide books and reading materials to students
- \$3 M Continuum of Care Fund for the Department of Children and Family Services to provide telecare and assist women with unplanned pregnancies
- \$1.8 M Small Business Innovation Research Grants for the Department of Economic Development to provide assistance to certain businesses who have applied for or received certain federal grants
- \$1.5 M Louisiana Wireless Information Network Tower in Thibodaux to provide communication and information sharing during emergencies and weather events

5. \$1.4 M - Unallotted

- Unspent Main Street Rescue funds were reverted back to La. Rescue Plan
- ARPA dollars have until Dec. 2024 to be obligated, and until Dec. 2026 to be spent Prepared by the House Fiscal Division – June 3, 2022
