

# **Descriptions of Usages:**

- 1. Fund Transfers Funding transfers through Act 167 detailed on page 2
- 2. Agency Projected Expenses Funding to ensure agencies meet anticipated year-end expenses
- **3. Disaster Cost Share and Closeout of Past Disasters-** Payments to FEMA for the state cost share of expenses related to recent disasters including closeout of past emergency declarations
- **4. Other Various Expenses** Specific appropriations to state agencies, local municipalities, non-governmental organizations, and payments for judgments
- 5. Capital Outlay Highway Program Matching funds for the federal Infrastructure Investment & Jobs Act
- 6. Hazard Mitigation Grant Program Funding to reseed the balance of the program
- 7. LGAP & CWEP Local Government Assistance Program and Community Water Enrichment Program

#### **Fund Transfers:**

Funding moved into special funds in the state treasury through directives in Act 167:

- 1. \$500 M Megaprojects Leverage Fund mega infrastructure project funding including \$300 M to Baton Rouge I-10 bridge, \$100 M to Lake Charles I-10 bridge, and \$100 M to I-49 South
- 2. \$100 M Construction Subfund
  Preservation Account highway and
  bridge preservation projects
- 3. \$135 M Self-Insurance Fund state insurance risk management program
- 4. \$130 M Capital Outlay Savings Fund cash funding for future capital outlay projects or deposit into the budget stabilization fund
- 5. \$50 M Jean Boudreaux Settlement Compromise Fund - payment resulting from the compromise agreement related to the Jean Boudreaux and the victims of the flood on April 6, 1983 judgment against the state
- 6. \$40 M Louisiana Early Childhood Education Fund - grant funding to expand the number of quality slots for early childhood care and education
- 7. \$10 M Major Events Incentive Fund grants for attracting, hosting, and staging major events pursuant to the Major Events Incentive Program

- 8. \$10 M La. Outdoors Forever Special Fund funding for outdoor conservation projects in the state
- 9. \$8 M Special Education Classroom

  Monitoring Fund installation of cameras
  in special education classrooms statewide
- 10. \$6.9 M Emergency Communications
  Interoperability Fund funding for
  alternatives to the Louisiana Wireless
  Information Network in the plan
  submitted by office of interoperability
  within GOHSEP and approved by JLCB
- 11. \$6 M Higher Ed. Initiatives Fund improvement of HIED institutions through strategic master plan initiatives
- 12. \$5 M Events Incentive Fund grants for local governmental entities, visitor bureaus, and non-profits for hosting, planning, and marketing events in state
- 13. \$5 M Engineering Fee Subfund of the Water Sector Fund grant funding to political subdivisions for engineering fees arising out of application to the Water Sector Program
- **14. \$5 M Geaux Teach Fund -** scholarships for students in teacher preparation programs
- **15.** \$1 M Blue Tarp Fund roof repairs for homeowners
