## -- President's Faith-Based Initiative Comes to Baton Rouge, LA -- Local Faith-Based & Community Organizations Learn How to Win Federal Grants

Washington, DC - December 21, 2005 - The Institute for Youth Development (IYD), the largest grantee under President Bush's Compassion Capital Fund Program, will bring together local faith-based and community organizations to learn how to win federal grants at the Compassion Capital Fund Intermediate Grant Writing Workshop

The workshop will be held on January 20 & 21, 2006 at Holiday Inn Select Executive Center Convention Hotel, 4728 Constitution Avenue in Baton Rouge. Hotel reservations can be made by calling 225-925-2244.

There is no workshop fee -- a required \$25.00 "no show" fee is refunded on site -- there is no parking fee, and lunch is provided. IYD will conduct sub-award competitions during 2006, and will award between 20 and 30 grants for up to \$30,000. This competition mirrors the federal grant making process and serves as a learning exercise for all who participate. Participation in a 2006 IYD workshop or a previous IYD-sponsored CCF grants educational conference will be a requirement for 2006 sub-award applicants.

This grant writing workshop is part of the historic Faith-Based and Community Initiative created by the President. It is designed to level the playing field for faith-based and community groups so they may participate in the myriad opportunities to receive federal grants.

"The President has empowered us by designing a program that allows for the full participation of faith-based and community groups while also allowing those groups to remain true to their beliefs, whether faith-based or not," said Shepherd Smith, IYD President. "At this educational conference, local organizations will learn how that is done."
