BATON ROUGE, LOUISIANA "The Louisiana Legislative Black Caucus (LLBC) applauds today's decision by the U.S. Supreme Court that will allow us to move forward as we fight for fair congressional maps in Louisiana. A state with an African-American population of 33% deserves to have their voices heard in Congress.

We realize that there is still some work to be done, but we are very confident that our state will have two black congressional districts by the 2024 congressional elections.
